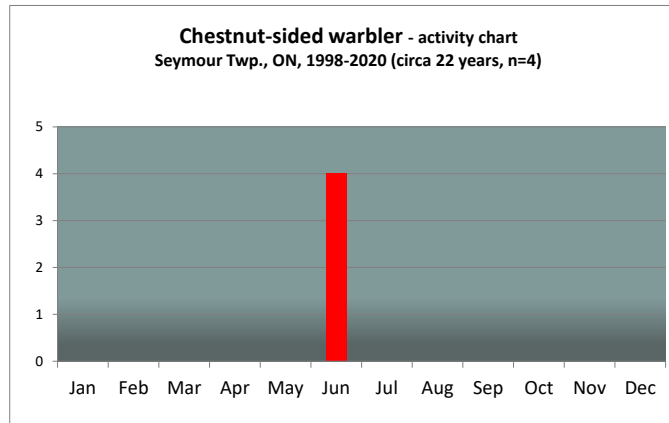
Note: the chart displays the number of days in a given month in which the species was seen. This says nothing of total bird numbers: though commonly with this species one sees just one bird at a time. The total of sighting days is a **minimum**, as the observer was not present continuously (some multi-week absences in some years), not observing from dawn to dusk, and not necessarily near feeders or the most attractive flowers.
